

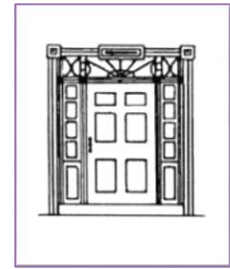

2018 Annual Report

38th Annual Meeting Minutes

April 23, 2018

Rhode Island Watercolor Society
Slater Park

President Barbara Zdravesky welcomed sixty guests to the meeting and expressed her thanks the Rhode Island Watercolor Society for hosting the event in the historic Potter Casino building. Attendees were invited to ride the Looff Carousel, opened this evening by courtesy of city's Parks and Recreation division. After several announcements and acknowledgements, Barbara gave a brief overview of the Society's activities in the past year and outlined plans for the rest of 2018.

The group recognized attendees whose homes were recently awarded historic marker plaques. Present were the owners of the Potter-Collyer house at 67 cedar Street, the Milton O. Black house at 83 Glenwood Avenue, and the Daniel H. Horton House at 93 Clyde Street.

Barbara announced that the Society was moving forward in the process to sell the Joseph Spaulding House at 30 Fruit Street.

Barbara introduced Donna Houle. Donna Houle is manager of special projects for the Blackstone Valley Tourism Council. She is a member of the National Carousel Association and has recently formed a Friends of the Carousel group with Pawtucket Parks Superintendent John Blais, with a mission to increase awareness in the community and raise funds for the continuing restoration of the Looff Carousel at Slater Park.

Highlights of Donna's talk are:

- *The Slater Park Looff Carousel was built c. 1895*
- *It was installed in Slater Park in 1910*
- *It is the oldest standing carousel in its original location*
- *It is the fastest carousel in the nation – at 9mph*
- *The original speed was 13mph*
- *There are 44 standing horses, 1 camel, 3 dogs, 1 giraffe, 1 lion, and 2 chariots*
- *The carousel features a North Tonawanda military band organ*
- *The brass ring has been removed*
- *The carousel has approximately 4,000 passengers each year*

In 1967 the carousel was closed and plans were made to sell it. Bids as low as \$5 were submitted for the horses. Community members signed petitions to stop the sale and the carousel was restored and re-opened in 1979.

Donna presented a short film on the history of Slater Park.

After Donna's presentation, Barbara Zdravesky presented a citation from the City of Pawtucket to Donna for her achievements and commitment to the community.
